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# What is Mesa Moves?

## Objective

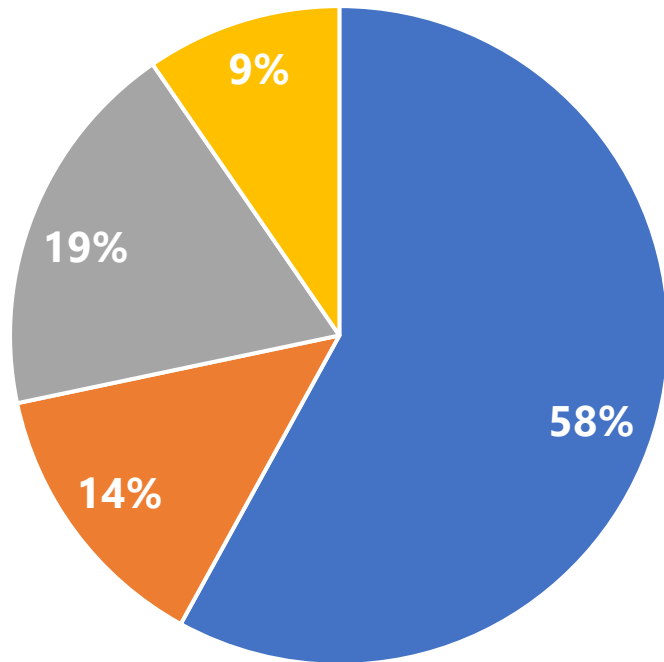
Create a bilingual community engagement campaign to collect feedback for transportation infrastructure priorities for city staff to develop recommendations to City Management and City Council on highest priority projects for future funding consideration.

## Public Outreach in 2019

- **6,222** Completed Surveys - 7 Questions
  - Website (English/Spanish), Google Publisher, Telemundo
- **8** Key Stakeholder In-Depth Interviews completed
- **5** Focus Groups held
- **4** Community Meetings

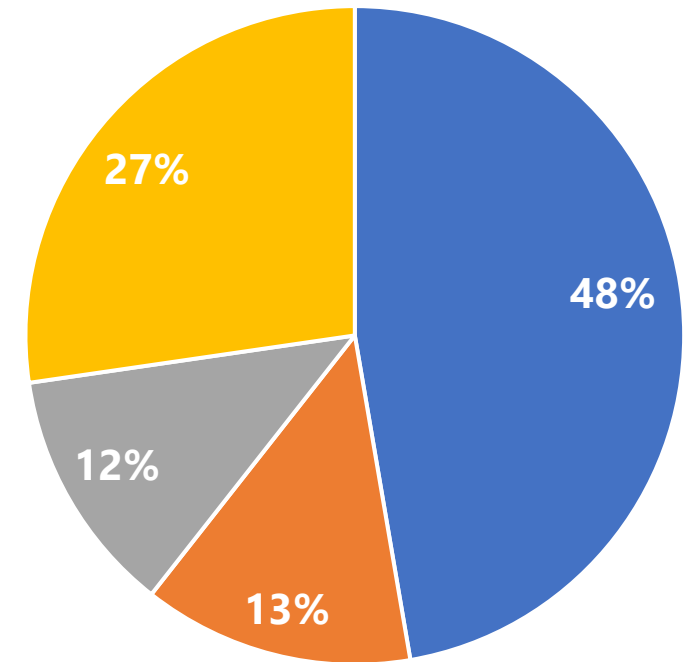
# Mesa Moves: Survey Results

Most Important During Commute



- Minimal Congestion
- Remove Bottlenecks
- Alternate Modes
- Adequate Bike Lanes

Transportation Initiatives Excluding Safety



- Well Maintained
- Well Planned
- Additional Bike
- Well Connected

*Mesa voters authorized, on November 3, 2020, the City of Mesa to issue \$100M of General Obligation Bonds to fund transportation projects throughout the City*

# 2020 Mesa Moves Bond Program Summary

## ***City of Mesa*** *General Obligation Street Bond*

### Regional Roadway Improvements

**\$93.0M**

Widen existing streets, improve intersection capacity and safety, and/or construct new arterial street segments that benefit the region

### Arterial Road Reconstruction

**\$7.0M**

Reconstruct street segments

**Bond Total: \$100.0M**

## ***Maricopa Association of Governments (MAG)*** *Funding*

### Regional Roadway Improvements

**\$4.0M**

Widen existing streets, improve intersection capacity and safety, and/or construct new arterial street segments that benefit the region

### Arterial Road Reconstruction

**\$38.0M**

Reconstruct street segments

### Active Transportation

**\$20.0M**

Enhance bike and pedestrian network

**Reimbursement Total: \$62.0M**

# Regional Roadway Improvements

## ***Street projects that include:***

- Widening existing streets
- Improving intersection safety/capacity
- Constructing new street segments that enhance connectivity and reduce congestion benefitting the region

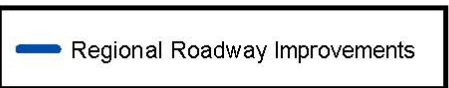
*Many of these projects will receive reimbursement monies from the federal government or MAG*

# Regional Roadway Improvements

- ***Signal Butte Road Improvements:*** Williams Field to Germann
- ***Broadway Road:*** Mesa Drive to Stapley
- ***Ellsworth Road:*** South City Limits to SR24
- ***Stapley and University Intersection***
- ***Val Vista: Pueblo to US 60***
- ***Sossaman and Baseline Intersection***
- ***Ray Road Connection to Ellsworth***
- ***Elliot Road:*** Sossaman to Ellsworth
- ***Sossaman Road:*** Ray to Warner
- ***Williams Field Road:*** Ellsworth to State Route 24
- ***City Share Program***





# Arterial Roadway Reconstruction Projects

- Rebuild existing street segments that have reached the end of their useful life
- Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) upgrades
- Staff has evaluated and prioritized street segments for reconstruction based on criteria such as safety, age, pavement condition, and repair history based on available funding

**\$45M**

# Arterial Roadway Reconstruction Projects

- ***Southern Avenue:*** Gilbert to Val Vista
- ***Country Club Drive:*** US60 to 8<sup>th</sup> Avenue
- ***Southern Avenue:*** Alma School to UPRR
- ***Stapley Drive:*** University to McKellips
- ***University Avenue:*** Mesa Drive to Harris
- ***Greenfield Road:*** Southern to Main
- ***Greenfield Road:*** Main to Adobe
- ***Broadway Road:*** Stapley to Gilbert
- ***Broadway Road:*** Country Club to Mesa Drive



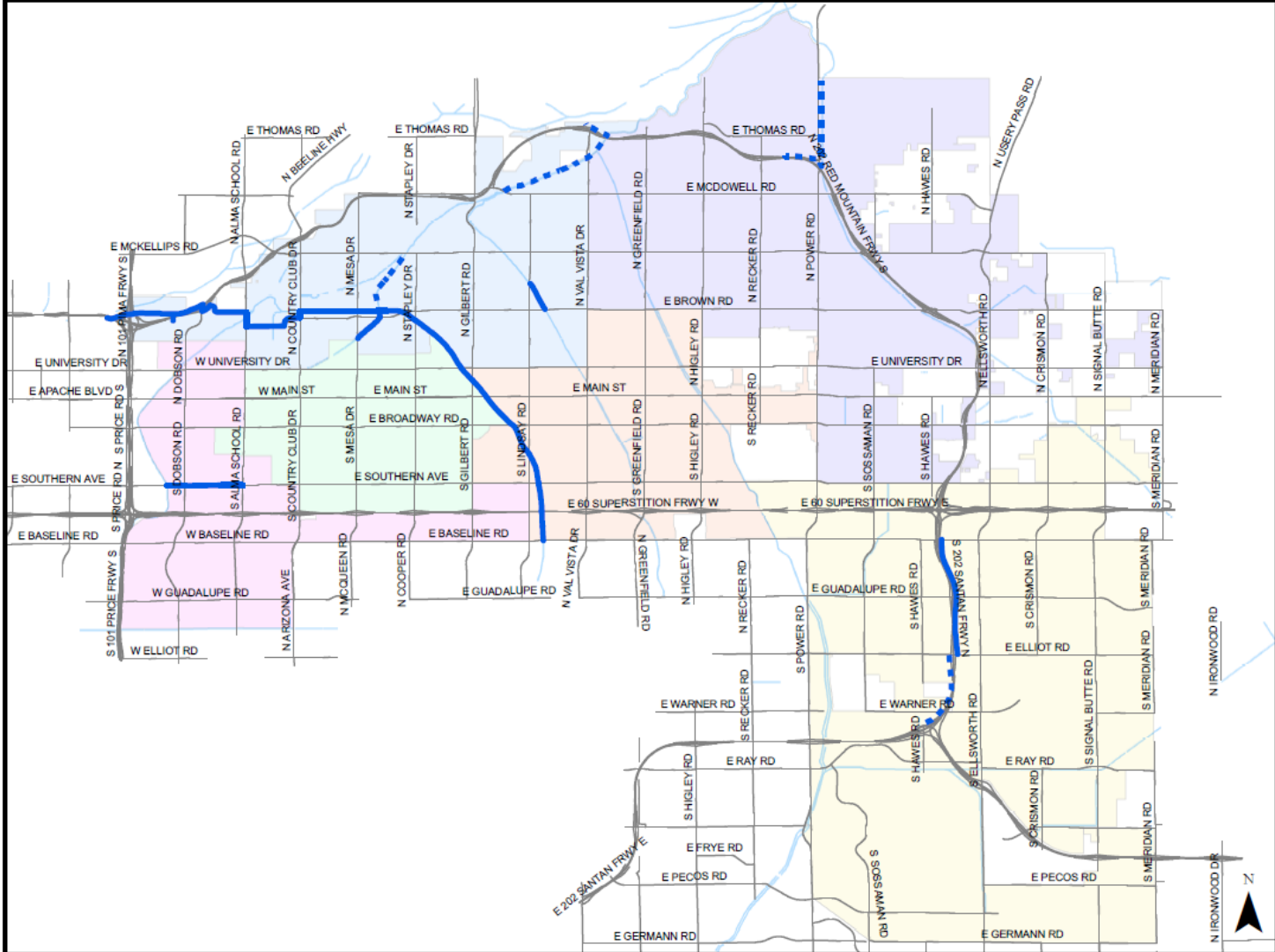
# Active Transportation Projects

- Projects to enhance Mesa's bicycle and pedestrian network to promote connectivity and health
- Projects will be identified citywide and discussed through a public engagement process
