Objective





Mesa voters authorized, on November 3, 2020, the City of Mesa to issue \$100M of General Obligation Bonds to fund transportation projects throughout the City







Arterial Roadway Reconstruction Projects

- Rebuild existing street segments that have reached the end of their useful life
- Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) upgrades
- Staff has evaluated and prioritized street segments for reconstruction based on criteria such as safety, age, pavement condition, and repair history based on available funding






Arterial Roadway Reconstruction Projects

- Southern Avenue: Gilbert to Val Vista
- Country Club Drive: US60 to 8th Avenue
- Southern Avenue: Alma School to UPRR
- **Stapley Drive:** University to McKellips
- University Avenue: Mesa Drive to Harris
- Greenfield Road: Southern to Main
- Greenfield Road: Main to Adobe
- Broadway Road: Stapley to Gilbert
- Broadway Road: Country Club to Mesa Drive


Active Transportation Projects
